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Edward Hicks specialises in private client, property and commercial litigation. He regularly appears in multi-track trials and has wide experience of mediations. He also undertakes a wide range of non-contentious chancery work. PROPERTY

Edward has wide experience of property litigation. He is ranked for property litigation in *The Legal 500 UK Bar* and for real estate litigation by *Chambers UK Bar*. Edward’s practice includes litigation concerning trusts of land, proprietary estoppel, equitable accounting, conveyancing disputes, boundary disputes, adverse possession claims, litigation over easements and restrictive covenants, legal and equitable charges and mortgages, landlord and tenant disputes, disrepair and possession actions. His work includes dealing with property related disputes in insolvency litigation, family litigation, in the administration of estates and in criminal confiscation proceedings.

Edward’s recent experience includes dealing with property other than land in England, including disputes concerning a luxury yacht, and also with foreign real property and conflicts of laws issues, including a claim in connection with a purported sale of a group of Balinese islands, and a case concerning the declaration of trusts pursuant to English law over French land.

Edward has recently acted in the second and third rounds of litigation between the parties to *Moorshead Mansions v Di Marco* [2008] EWCA Civ 1371 in relation to a dispute as to the ability of a tenant owned landlord company to raise money from its members as shareholders rather than raising service charge from them as tenants.

Edward’s recent landlord and tenant work also includes acting in a claim for

forfeiture of a £2m maisonette in Mayfair and acting successfully for the owner of a four star hotel in Manchester in a disrepair claim against the freeholder.

COURT OF PROTECTION

Edward regularly acts in Court of Protection litigation, including representing the Official Solicitor. Recent work includes advising and litigating in relation to statutory wills, both challenging and defending the appointment of attorneys, and protecting the welfare of dementia patients.

COMMERCIAL DISPUTES
