## **15:45-16:30 - Breakout Session**

### **1. International Restructures and Insolvencies (Great Eastern Room)**

Christopher Boardman KC and Andrew Brown alongside guest speaker Sonya Van de Graaff of Katten Muchin Rosenman will discuss and debate the proposed adoption of the Model Law on Enterprise Group Insolvencies and Article X of the Model Law on Recognition and Enforcement of Insolvency-Related Judgments, and how this might affect the local insolvency industry.

In particular, they will look at the threat to the longstanding rule in *Gibbs* by allowing enforcement of foreign insolvency judgments, and how international group insolvencies might be administered within England.

### **2. Lessons From FTX and Practical Tips for Crypto Claims (Fenchurch Suite)**

Adam Deacock and Zachary Kell will host a panel discussion with guest speakers Emma Fayers and Mark Sinka of PwC looking at the incredible rise and fall of the crypto exchange FTX, the liquidation of which PwC is currently assisting in. The panel will examine some of the key considerations involved in the liquidation of an exchange, the ways in which crypto assets may be traced as well as some of the recent crypto caselaw to know.
